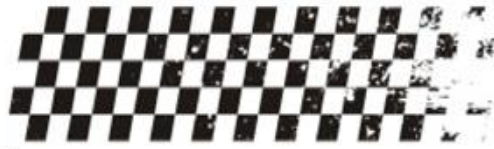

1. ANNOUNCEMENT

The Newman Motorcycle Club Inc, hereafter called the Promoter will conduct Newman Echo Park Memorial for Special Regional Club Event at the Echo Park Track, McBride Drive, Newman, on Saturday 5th March 2016

2. JURISDICTION

2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling WA which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number [tba] and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National Club or one event Licences.

2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any final instructions approved by Motorcycling WA. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

3. EVENT OFFICIALS

4. ENTRIES

4.1 Entries for this event will be available on-line at Register Now, go to Newman Motorcycle Club website for link. www.newmanmx.com Entries Close 2nd March, Late entries will not be accepted.

4.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Newman Motorcycle Club.

4.3 Only entries received on the official entry form that is accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.

4.4 Entry fees will only be refunded if a rider informs Newman Motorcycle Club in writing, 10 days before the event. A medical certificate is required if a rider withdraws less than 10 days before the event.

5. ENTRY FEE

5.1 All nominations will only be accepted on the Register Now website.

5.2 Payment is required when nominating on the website. Juniors entry fee - \$60

5.3 One Day Licenses are available for \$60

5.4 No late nominations will be accepted.

5.5 Nominations will close prior to the event, specifically 2nd March 2016.

6. INSURANCE

6.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.

6.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits insurance.

7. MEDICAL SERVICES

St John Ambulance Service will be in attendance for the event, from 2pm

8. SCRUTINEERING

8.1 Scrutineering will begin at 12.00pm – 2.00pm

8.2 Machines entered in the competition must have successfully passed a machine examination prior to taking part in practice, qualifying or racing. A Newman Motorcycle Club sticker will be placed on the front number plate to indicate that it has been successfully examined.

8.3 Current competition licences and full riding gear must be presented at scrutineering. Eligibility checks can take place at any time during the meeting. Machines which suffer accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again.

8.4 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

8.5 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

9. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

50cc Auto Division - 7 to under 9 years
65cc - 7 to Under 10 years
65cc - 10 to Under 12years
85cc - 9 to12 years
85cc - 12 to 16 years
90cc Quad - 9 to 12 years
125cc Junior Lite - 12 to Under 16 years
250cc Junior Lite - 12 to Under 16 years
250cc Quad - 12 to Under 16 years

10. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

10.1 To constitute a class for the purpose of gaining Championship status, the number of contestants entered and competing in each class shall be three (3) for juniors.

10.2 Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, will be at the discretion of the Newman Motorcycle Club Inc, subject to Motorcycling WA approval.

11. START METHOD

Self-penalising drop gates will be used for the starts.

20 second board displayed to all riders, after 15 seconds, 5 seconds will be displayed

Gates will drop between 5 and 0 seconds

12. FINISH METHOD

A white flag will be displayed to the riders indicating one lap remains. The chequered flag is displayed to signal the race is finished.

13. RACE FORMAT

Race format will be as per below with a practice, and 3 rounds. Each division will do 4 laps.

1 Major Feature will be the final race of the night, consisting of 5 laps, entries open to Junior Lites classes only.

50cc Div 2
65cc 7-10yrs
65cc 10-13yrs
90cc Quad
85cc 9-12yrs
85cc 12-16yrs
125cc Junior Lites / 250cc Junior Lites
250cc Quad

14. EVENT SCHEDULE

Gates open 8am
Scrutineering 12.00pm – 2.00pm
Riders Meeting 2.00pm – 2.15pm
Flaggy Brief 2.15pm – 2.30pm
Practice 2.30pm – 3.30pm
Racing starts 3.30pm

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 12.00pm with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

15. AWARDS AND PRIZE MONEY

Trophies will be awarded in all junior classes based on entries received. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each class where three (3) or more entries are received. If there is less than the required amount of riders, then the classes may be combined with the approval of the Steward of the meeting. Junior Lites feature riders will receive small gifts as token for the event, motorbike supplies of sorts.

16. GST

The Goods and Services Tax affects the payment of prize money. Prize money is not available for junior events, therefore GST does not apply.

17. PRESENTATIONS

Presentations will take place at the end of racing at the track.

18. MACHINES AND RIDERS

18.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Motor cross competition.

18.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

18.3 A change of machine is permitted as per GCR's on the condition that **written** notification must be in the hands of the clerk of course at least 10 minutes prior to the race in which the substitution is to be made and further, that the replacement machine must have been correctly entered, examined and passed at machine examination.

19. RIDING NUMBERS

Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their registered riding number or their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Newman Motorcycle Club Inc. discretion.
All number plates on all machines **MUST** comply with the GCRs and must not contain any decals or advertising other than the required Newman Motorcycling Club sticker.

20. GRID POSITIONS

Peg selection will be used for each race for gate position.

21. RIDERS' BRIEFING

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors, volunteers and junior parents **MUST** attend. Details will be included in the final instructions.

22. TRACK WALK

All participating competitors must be given the opportunity to walk the track prior to any on track participation.

23. FACILITIES

Full canteen will be running. Bar is on site, and alcohol is only to be consumed in licensed area. Please obey parking promoters' instructions on parking. As we are sponsored by Heathway, and promoting Smarter Than Smoking, there should be no smoking around seating, bar and canteen area, or in the pits.

ANTI-DOPING POLICY

23.1 All competitors and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, as carried out by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. Refer to GCR 11 for details.

23.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, tel 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prize money may be delayed at Motorcycling WAs discretion until the results of the tests are known.

24. ALCOHOL TESTING PROCEDURE

All competitors and officials are advised that random breath-testing may take place during the competition.

25. CODE OF CONDUCT

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Code of Conduct contained within MA's Member Protection Regulations, found at www.ma.org.au or Appendix 3 of the GCR, which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This Code of Conduct applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

26. ACCOMMODATION

Camping will be allowed at our track, in the designated camping area behind the pits, across McBride Drive. Camping is NOT permitted in the pitting areas or in the spectator carpark.
